


Hello and welcome to Skywaves 93.



Peterborough falls off-air

Fire knocks out FM radio services - http://news.bbc.co.uk/2/hi/uk_news/england/cambridgeshire/3969491.stm

A major fire at a transmitter has left an estimated 1.3m radio listeners without an FM service.

The mast at Morborne, Peterborough, Cambs, caught fire on Saturday evening, collapsing onto transmitter buildings and neighbouring fields.

Radios 1,2, 3 and 4, BBC Radio Cambridgeshire, BBC digital radio and Classic FM are all affected.

The transmitter covers Cambs, and parts of Lincs, Northants, Leicestershire, Beds, Bucks and west Norfolk.

Mobile telephone reception has also been affected.

Scenes of crime experts and forensic teams are at the transmitter site, which is owned by Crown Castle International.

Some FM radio services in parts of the east of England have been affected after a transmitter caught fire.

The 580ft mast at Morborne, Peterborough, Cambs, caught fire on Saturday, collapsing onto transmitter buildings and neighbouring fields.

Radios 1,2, 3 and 4, BBC Radio Cambridgeshire, BBC digital radio and Classic FM were all affected, along with some mobile telephone reception.

Detectives think the fire may have been deliberate and appealed for witnesses.

Gary Martin of Cambs Police, said: "We have a number of theories and we're not resting on any particular one.

FM reception in parts of several counties has been affected

"But we need to know - was there anyone suspicious in the area or were there any bangs or fireworks or rockets flying through the air?

"Has anyone seen where the tower was ablaze - was it at the top of the tower, the middle or the bottom of the tower?"

Following the fire, an estimated 1.3m radio listeners were without an FM service.

Broadcasters are working to restore service and it is unclear how many areas are still affected.

The transmitter, which is owned by Crown Castle International, covers Cambs, and parts of Lincs, Northants, Leicestershire, Beds, Bucks and west Norfolk.

On the evening of Saturday 30-Oct-2004 there was a fire at the Peterborough site.

As a result the mast totally collapsed, falling onto the transmitter buildings and neighbouring fields.

There were no casualties but of course all services from Peterborough went off the air!

By 1720 GMT on Sunday 31-Oct-2004 ntl were providing temporary low-power service of Classic FM and DAB from their nearby Gunthorpe site.

07|10|04 - Ofcom advertises new FM commercial radio licence for Durham

Ofcom today advertises a new local FM commercial radio licence to cover the city of Durham and the surrounding area.

Ofcom estimates that this licence could achieve coverage of an area with an adult (aged 15+) population of around 160,000. However, the exact coverage will be determined by the location of the transmission site and other technical characteristics. Up to two FM frequencies are being made available for this licence.

The closing date for the submission of applications is 5.00 p.m. on Thursday, 6 January 2005. A non-refundable fee of £1,500 will be payable for each application submitted.

The full details for this licence, including the guidelines and procedures for the submission of applications, can be obtained from the Ofcom website.

Manchester

10|11|04 - Ofcom advertises new FM commercial radio licences for Manchester

Ofcom is advertising an FM commercial radio licence to cover the city of Manchester and surrounding area.

The measured coverage area of this new service is likely to contain an adult population (aged 15+) of around 1.3 million, which is more restrictive than that achieved by the existing Galaxy 102 service, which contains around 1.6 million adults. The exact coverage will be determined by the location of the transmission site and other technical characteristics. The proposed frequency (97.7 MHz) for this licence is subject to international agreement on radio spectrum usage.

The closing date for the submission of applications is 5.00 p.m. on 9 February 2005 . A non-refundable fee of £12,000 will be payable for each application submitted.

The full details for this licence, including the guidelines and procedures for the submission of applications, can be obtained from the Ofcom website.

Banbury

10|11|04 - Ofcom advertises new FM commercial radio licences for Banbury

Ofcom is inviting applications for a licence to provide an FM commercial radio service to cover the town of Banbury and surrounding area.

Ofcom estimates this licence could achieve coverage of an area with an adult population (aged 15+) of around 70,000. However, the exact coverage will be determined by the location of the transmission site and other technical characteristics.

The closing date for the submission of completed applications will be 5.00 p.m. on 9 February 2005 . A non-refundable fee of £1,500 will be payable for each application submitted.

The full details for this licence, including the guidelines and procedures for the submission of applications, can be obtained from the Ofcom website.

General information

All three licences will be issued for a twelve year period.

All applications for these licences will be published on the Ofcom website as soon as is practicable after the closing date.

Ofcom welcomes the views of the public about the local needs of listeners in these areas and the types of services required.


West Sound becomes SouthWest Sound

DTT New Radio & TV Channels

Whilst the station focuses on sport, mainly football, cricket and golf, it also has non-sports output with such renowned broadcasters as James Whale, Mike Dickin, Ian Collins and Mike Mendoza. talkSPORT will have live sporting events form a vital part of the programming mix and full live commentary of England football internationals, FA Cup games, major golf competitions and Test cricket. FreeView channel 94.



3C brings an entirely new music format to the UK: contemporary country. Think Shania Twain and LeAnn Rimes, along with musically compatible artists like Tom Petty and Bruce Springsteen. SWITCHED ANTENNA SOCKETS for SONY TUNERS - by Julian Hardstone

The Sony range of PLL tuners is popular with FM DXers because of the facilities available, and because it is easy to change the 10.7MHz IF filters for narrower ones. Some models have the facility to switch in a fourth IF filter to give some reduction in bandwidth (for ex. ST-S370). A few Sony tuners have switchable antenna inputs (for ex. SA3ES) which is very valuable for DXers with more than one ærial, but many more have have a switchable input attenuator and a single input socket; these models can easily be converted for two input sockets, by giving up the attenuator function. If, like me, you do not regularly need to use the attenuator, you can benefit by converting to a second input.




Fig.1 Original switched Attenuator

The input attenuator is selected by a relay, which can be heard operating when you select this function, and it is a trivial job to rewire the relay to a second antenna connector. A Belling Lee -type ærial socket - the type used on all TVs in Great Britain - can be bought or salvaged, and mounted close to the original connector on the rear panel of the tuner. Note that the original connector is usually a 'male' type requiring the use of a female-to-female adaptor. The attenuator 'pad' on my ST-S370 is probably the same as on all other Sony tuners: it consists of three resistors connected as a 'T' attenuator, giving a 9dB loss, as shown in Fig.1.




Fig.2 Simple modification for Switched I-P




Fig.3 Fully terminated modification

The simplest modification is to connect the new socket in place of the attenuator resistor as shown in Fig.2. With a little more work, you could do a radical rewiring of the relay, such that the unused input is correctly terminated with a new 750hm resistor - see Fig.3. This may conceivably offer some benefit in reducing re-radiation from the unused antenna.
